




## Messy Church

The children who come to Messy Church on the second Tuesday of the month are still enjoying the different activities which we do. We start with a group activity/game which the children can just join in with as they arrive. The children then go into Storytime while the parents enjoy a cuppa and chat.



After story the children and parents get involved with the various crafts, which are related to the story, and then it is “get-together time” for a re-run of what has happened. We then have a cooked meal together before it is time to go home.

In September we welcomed Rev Rosemary Nash into the group and although the things we do are roughly the same we have changed the format of when we do them, finishing with tea together so that the families can go home afterwards.

We are getting new families coming and families leaving as their children start different weekly activities. At present we have between 18 and 26 children coming each month. Messy Church is aimed at school-age children but younger brothers and sisters are welcome and toys are provided for them to play with so that the older children and parent can concentrate on the activities.

We let the families know of any Social/Fundraising events that we are holding at church and we find that they do support us.

Thanks go to our loyal leaders who prepare interesting activities each week, never knowing how many children will be present, nor what the age range will be.




There are currently 7 children on our Cradle Roll, and we regularly see most of them with their families at our church services and Messy Church.

## Sierra Leone

Towards the end of 2010 Church Council agreed to start a Partnership with Christian Aid to raise funds for farming and water projects in Sierra Leone. The deal was that if we raised £5,000 the European Union would make it into nearly £20,000 but we must do it within a certain time scale. Our church does like a challenge and with many different fundraising schemes happening £5,000 was raised by the end of October 2011.



Still full of enthusiasm and with surplus Sierra Leone funds we decided in January 2012 to sign up for another £5,000 project, which again would be raised to £20,000 by the European Union, this time for Maternal Health in the Kailahun area of Sierra Leone.

We have nearly completed this second project with just a few hundred pounds still to raise. We have two Galas which we have agreed to attend with our stall in May and June and hopefully we will raise enough to complete the project.

We couldn't have done this without the help of the whole church, who have baked, knitted, sewn, arranged and performed in concerts, done sponsored walks, organized fairs and galas, and done all the menial tasks that go with these events. Thank you all.

Included in "Collections" is £3,947 we received from HMRC as **Gift Aid**. If you pay income tax and currently aren't in the scheme, please consider letting the Church claim **Gift Aid** on your behalf. Just speak to either myself or Joan Wright to make the arrangements.

There's no commitment to give a set amount every week - and for every £1 you give we get another 25p from HMRC.



Over the year we made a loss of £1,819, mainly caused by the fact we didn't have a Christmas Fayre or a Flower Festival. We also increased our Circuit Share by £5,000 compared to the previous year.

But on 31 August 2012, we had £56,923 in the bank.
