

## Why are we here? (part six)

John had come to an impasse. He was adamant that communion could only be administered by ordained ministers, yet the Bishops were now united in preventing any more Methodists and any who had passed their scrutiny could not get a parish and hence no income. Lady Huntingdon spent her considerable wealth in assisting but this was no permanent solution. John's solution to the problem was positive, if at odds with his aim to remain within the C.of E., he ordained his own, the preserve of Bishops. Such clergy could only be acceptable to his own followers and from then on Wesleyism was a denomination on its own although still not registered as dissenting. John instituted his own theological college for young men with a comprehensive course of his own devising. One result was that some Wesleyan clergy considered themselves, with some justification, a cut above their Anglican counterparts and even looked down on their own lay preachers which was to lead to the Independent Churches. It is still a sore point with some Anglicans that there was such a revulsion to Wesley (the duke of Wellington's family name was changed from Wesley to Wellesley) that it hindered their own internal reform by at least fifty years.
